The homeowners wanted a master suite addition. The challenge for the designer was to create a seamless integration of the original and new structures. A screened porch was demolished and replaced with a rotunda of reclaimed marble checkerboard flooring that connects the addition with the rest of the house. The new space now features a master hall, an open stairwell leading to the lower level, and a small wet bar, missing from the original house. The master suite itself is luxuriously appointed, with silk wallcovering and sumptuous fabrics.

This project required the designer to transform a dreary basement into an entertainment area complete with full kitchen, wine cellar, and guest quarters matching the clients' love of bright and cheery rooms with touches of rustic and industrial design. The result features a neutral palette with navy and stainless steel accents. Handcrafted design elements include Missouri black walnut shelving built by Architectural Elements and a custom live-edge walnut slab fabricated by Lamp Wine Cellar.

Folding glass doors on two walls open onto the veranda on one side and onto the courtyard on the other. The designer chose to play off of this expanse of glass with a floor-to-ceiling board-formed concrete fireplace. The look is sleek and modern, but the woodgrain detail in the concrete adds warmth. The furnishings consist of modern elements in all-natural materials, including two fur-covered ottomans. The coffered ceiling provides a sense of intimacy. "I love the contrast of light and dark and the symmetric element of the art," says judge Angela Tafoya.
